# Fish

## Blue spotted ray

- A blue spotted ray doesn't have bones.
- They hide by burying themselves in the seabed.
- Blue spotted rays swim by flapping their fins.
- They eat small fish, crabs and shellfish.

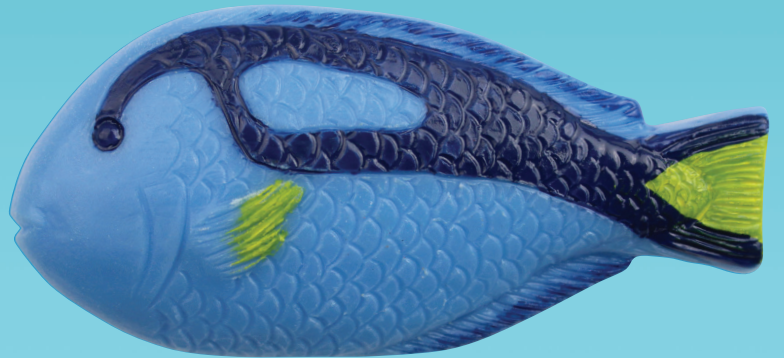


## Peppermint angelfish

- Peppermint angelfish live deep in the oceans.
- They are named after the striped candy.
- Peppermint angelfish are shy.
- It is rare for divers to see a peppermint angelfish.

## Blue tang

- Dory in *Finding Nemo* is a blue tang.
- Blue tangs live in and around coral reefs.
- They have two sharp spines to defend themselves.
- Baby blue tangs are bright yellow.



## Clownfish

- Nemo in *Finding Nemo* is a clownfish.
- They make clicking and popping sounds.
- Clownfish live among anemones on coral reefs.
- They can be black, yellow, or red, not just orange.

- Baby golden butterflyfish are not golden.

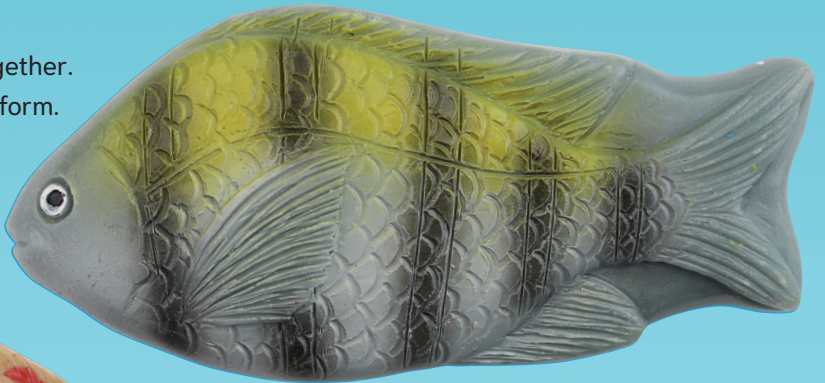


## Jewel cichlid

- Jewel cichlids have sparkling spots on their bodies.
- They can be fierce fighters.
- Jewel cichlids live in fresh water.
- A mother jewel cichlid keeps her babies in her mouth.

## Sergeant major fish

- Hundreds of sergeant major fish can feed together.
- They have stripes like those on a soldier's uniform.
- Male sergeant major fish guard their eggs.
- It is also called the five-finger fish.



## Plaice

- The plaice is a flat fish.
- It lives on the seabed.
- Plaice have good camouflage.
- Both eyes are on the same side of their face.
